**Las Vegas 51<sup>s</sup>/Toronto Blue Jays Affiliation:** The 51<sup>s</sup> completed their first season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays on September 7...Las Vegas, on Sept. 22, 2008, announced a two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Blue Jays...Las Vegas was the Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers for eight seasons (2001-08)...the Las Vegas Stars was the Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres for 18 seasons (1983-2000)...in 27 seasons, Las Vegas has captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 and 1988)...Las Vegas last appeared in the PCL Playoffs in 2002.

**2009 HOME ATTENDANCE:** In 71 dates, Las Vegas' total was **337,388** for an average of **4,752**...the 51<sup>s</sup> season high crowd was 10,405 vs. Sacramento on May 11 for the Sixth Annual Cox Communications School Day...the Las Vegas franchise has reached the 300,000 plateau in "home" attendance in all **27** seasons (1983-2009)...the 51s welcomed the "**9 Millionth Fan**" to Cashman Field on Saturday, August 29...**Carlos Ochoa**, 10-years-old, was the lucky fan and won 2010 season tickets, a gift certificate to the 51s Store, a 51s Goodie Bag and a "Welcome To Fabulous Las Vegas" sign!...the all-time attendance total now stands at 9,024,478!

**2009 PCL Most Valuable Player:** The Pacific Coast League announced on September 4 that **Randy Ruiz** of the Las Vegas 51s was named the 2009 PCL Most Valuable Player, an honor annually chosen by the League's managers and media representatives...he led the league in RBI (106), doubles (43) and extra base hits (70)...his (.320) batting average ranked seventh in the league...the first baseman ranked fourth in the PCL in slugging percentage (.584) and in home runs (25)...Ruiz becomes the fifth player in the 27-year Las Vegas franchise history to win the PCL MVP: OF **Kevin McReynolds** (1983), 1B **Tim Pyznarski** (1986), C **Sandy Alomar** (1988 & 1989) and 1B **Phil Hiatt** (2001).

**51<sup>s</sup> Briefings:** Las Vegas led the Pacific Coast League in team batting average (.290) for the second consecutive season and the third time in the 27-year franchise history (.301, 2008 and .289, 1986)...the pitching staff set a franchise record for most shutouts in a season with 11 (previous record was 10 in 2001)...since beginning the season at 6-18 (.250), Las Vegas compiled a record of 65-55 (.542) over the final 120 games.

**Pink Out Night (June 20):** The 51<sup>s</sup> organization presented "Pink Out Night" in conjunction with **The Southern Nevada Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure Organization**...the Las Vegas organization donated a total of **\$11,400** to the organization (\$1.00 from everyone in attendance (8,404) plus \$3,000 generated from the jersey auction)...51<sup>s</sup> players and coaches wore "Pink Jerseys" for the special game.

**The Silver State Diamond Challenge (Season Series was tied 8-8):** The 51<sup>s</sup> and Aces developed the **Silver State Diamond Challenge** and accompanying trophy (Silver Plate) to add to the excitement of the new intrastate rivalry each summer..."The City of Reno and all of Northern Nevada embrace the Aces," said Reno Mayor **Bob Cashell**. "We are excited about our inaugural season in the Pacific Coast League, especially the season challenge with our neighbors to the south. I want to remind Oscar that the North won the last time the two sides did battle."...the 16-game series concluded on August 30 in Las Vegas...since the season series was tied after 16 games, the Silver State Diamond Challenge winner will be determined in true Nevada style with a draw of the cards (TBA)..."It is great to welcome professional baseball to Northern Nevada and we wish the Aces the best of luck – except when their playing the 51<sup>s</sup> of course," said Las Vegas Mayor **Oscar B. Goodman**. "I think this challenge is great for all the baseball fans in the state."...In addition to the Diamond Challenge, Mayors Goodman and Cashell have placed their own wager in which the losing city's Mayor will wear the other team's jersey for a full day of city business – including a city council meeting. The Mayors have also agreed to the losing Mayor personally donating \$100 per game for the difference in wins from the season series to the winning Mayor's charity of choice.

**2009 PCL Hitter and Pitcher of the Week:** Infielder **Brett Harper** was named PCL Hitter of the Week on **May 11** and Left-hander **Fabio Castro** (1-0, 0.00 ERA, 13 IP/OR) was named PCL Pitcher of the Week on **May 11**...Castro's consecutive scoreless innings pitched streak was snapped at 24.1 vs. Oklahoma City (May 21)...infielder **Kevin Howard** was named the **PCL Hitter of the Week** on **June 29**...in 6 games, he batted .500 (12-for-24) with 4 doubles, 2 home runs and 9 RBI...infielder **Joe Inglett** was named the **PCL Hitter of the Week** on **July 6**...in 7 games, he batted .640 (16-for-25) with 5 doubles, HR, 7 RBI...outfielder **Jason Lane** was named the **PCL Hitter of the Week** on **July 13**...in 6 games, he batted .478 (11-for-23) with 2 doubles, 3 HR, 5 RBI...outfielder **Travis Snider** was named the **PCL Hitter of the Week** on **August 3**...in 7 games, he batted .538 (14-for-26) with 7 doubles, 3 HR, 15 RBI.

**51<sup>s</sup> on Radio in 2009:** **Russ Langer** broadcasted 144 games on **FOX Sports Radio 920 AM** and on [www.LV51.com](http://www.LV51.com) via **SportsJuice.com**. Langer completed his 10<sup>th</sup> season behind the mike...he is a four-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcasted 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcasted selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009.

**51<sup>s</sup> Manager Mike Basso:** He was named the 19<sup>th</sup> manager (Oct. 8, 2008) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 – 2009, 27 seasons). **Career Summary:** He completed his first season as manager of the 51<sup>s</sup>...his career minor league managerial record in 11 seasons (1995-2000, 2003-06, 2009) is 763-717 (.516) and 135-152 (.470) in two seasons on the Triple-A level (2006, Syracuse; 2009, Las Vegas)...has posted a career minor league managerial post-season record of 18-14 (.563), which included the 2004 championship at Double-A New Hampshire. **Minor League Coaching Career:** Compiled a 692-644 record (.518) in 10 seasons as a minor league manager in the San Diego (1995-2000) and Toronto (2003-06) organizations...in 2004, he guided Double-A New Hampshire to the Eastern League championship...began his coaching career in 1995 as hitting coach (first half of the season) for the Las Vegas Stars...then managed the 1995 Rookie-level Idaho Falls team...managed Single-A Rancho Cucamonga for three seasons (1996-98) and during that span the team posted a record of 223-197 (.531), twice winning a club record 77 games in a season and qualifying for the playoffs each season...was promoted to Double-A Mobile and managed for two seasons (1999-2000) and then served as San Diego's advance scout at the major league level for two seasons (2001-02)...in 2003, he joined the Blue Jays organization (Nov. 19, 2002) and was named as the manager for Single-A Dunedin...in his first season, was named the Florida State League Manager of the Year after leading the Blue Jays to the league final...was named the 2003 recipient of the Blue Jays' Bobby Mattick Player Development Award,

recognizing the top manager or coach within the Club's minor league player development system...then managed at Double-A New Hampshire for two seasons (2004-05) and compiled a career-best 85-57 record (.596) in 2004 and captured the league championship...was named the 2004 Eastern League Manager of the Year...in 2006, he was named the 35th manager in the history of the Triple-A Syracuse Chiefs of the International League...on Nov. 21, 2006, was named Coordinator of Instruction for the Toronto Blue Jays minor league system and served in that capacity for two seasons (2007-08).

**Playing Career:** Played a total of nine seasons in the minor leagues (1986-94) and progressed as far as Triple-A Las Vegas as a catcher in the Padres organization...played in parts of four seasons for the Stars (1988, 1990, '92-93)...his career was slowed by a series of back and knee injuries and, in 1993, he batted .253 with the Stars...spent the 1994 season as a player-coach with Rancho Cucamonga of the California League...appeared in 537 career minor league games and batted .246 (417-for-1,693) with a career-best .298 with Spokane in 1986.

**Personal:** Resides in Pearland, Texas and is a 1982 graduate of Pearland High School and a 2002 inductee to the school's Hall of Fame...attended the University of Houston (1984-86) and was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 18th round of the 1986 draft.

**51<sup>s</sup> Coaching Staff:** **Ken Joyce** completed his first season as the Blue Jays' Triple-A hitting instructor...has been a member of the Toronto organization since the 2002 season...served as hitting instructor for the past two seasons (2007-08) with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats of the Eastern League. **Dave LaRoche** completed his second season overall (1987, 2009) as the Blue Jays' Triple-A pitching coach and has been a member of the Toronto organization since the 2005 season...served as pitching coach for the past four seasons (2005-08) with Double-A New Hampshire...enjoyed a successful 14-year Major League career with California (1970-71, 1977-80), Minnesota (1972), Chicago Cubs (1973-74), Cleveland (1975-77) and New York Yankees (1981-83)...father of Adam and Andy LaRoche of the Pittsburgh Pirates.
