Las Vegas 51^s/Toronto Blue Jays Affiliation: The 51^s completed their third season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays...Las Vegas has compiled an overall record of 208-224 (.481) as the top farm club of the Blue Jays (2009-2011)...Las Vegas, on Sept. 21, 2010, announced that they extended the Player Development Contract (PDC) with Toronto for two seasons (2011-12)...Las Vegas was the Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers for eight seasons (2001-08)...the Las Vegas Stars were the Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres for 18 seasons (1983-2000)...in 29 seasons, Las Vegas has captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 and 1988)...Las Vegas last appeared in the PCL Playoffs in 2002.

2011 HOME ATTENDANCE: In 70 dates, Las Vegas' total was **314,032** for an average of **4,486**...the season-high crowd was 11,001 vs. Round Rock on May 17 for the annual Cox Communications School Day...the Las Vegas franchise has reached the 300,000 plateau in "home" attendance in all **29** seasons (1983-2011)...the all-time attendance total now stands at **9,674,998**.

51^s on Radio in 2011: Russ Langer broadcast all 144 games on **FOX Sports Radio 920 AM** and on www.LV51.com. Langer completed his 12th season behind the mike...he is a six-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010.

51^s Manager Marty Brown: He was named the 21st manager (Nov. 30, 2010) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 – 2011, 29 seasons). **Career Summary:** He completed his first season as manager of the 51s...career minor league managerial record in 10 seasons is 704-655 (.518) and 445-414 (.518) over six seasons on the Triple-A Level (2001-05, 2011)...was named the 2004 International League Manager of the Year and was also named 2004 Minor League Manager of the Year by *Baseball America*.

Minor League Coaching Career: Compiled a 633-582 (.525) record in nine seasons (entering the 2011 campaign) as a minor league manager in the Pittsburgh and Cleveland organizations from 1997-2005...the Oklahoma native began his managerial career in 1997 at Single-A Erie and after two seasons at Double-A Altoona of the Eastern League (1999-2000), he was promoted to the Triple-A level at Nashville of the Pacific Coast League...following two seasons with the Sounds (2001-02), he joined the Cleveland organization as manager of Triple-A Buffalo of the International League for three seasons (2003-05)...compiled a three-year mark of 238-193 (.552) with the Bisons...led the team to the IL title in 2004 after a regular season record of 83-61 (.576) and also guided the club to a first place finish in their division in 2005 with an 82-62 (.569) record.

Japanese Professional Baseball Coaching Career: He managed four seasons in the Japanese Central League with the Hiroshima Toyo Carp (2006-09) and one season in the Pacific League with the Tohoku Rakuten Golden Eagles (2010).

Playing Career: He began his professional career in 1985 when drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 12th round of the Major League Baseball Draft...appeared in 35 games over two seasons with the Reds (1988-89) and one year with Baltimore (1990), who selected him in the Rule 5 Draft in winter of 1989...made his Major League debut in 1988 and recorded his first ML hit on Sept. 25, 1988 against Atlanta...drove in a ML career-high three runs vs. N.Y. Mets on July 6, 1989...then played in Japan for three seasons with Hiroshima Toyo Carp (1992-94)...played eight seasons (1985-91, 1995) in the minor leagues with the Cincinnati, Baltimore, Cleveland and Texas organizations and appeared in 814 career games and batted .274 (778-for-2,840) with 85 home runs and 409 RBI.

College Career: He played two years at University of Georgia (1984-85) and was named team co-captain and MVP during his senior season...as a junior, batted .343 with 13 HR and 46 RBI in 44 games and, as a senior, batted .373 with 15 HR and 62 RBI in 65 games...prior to enrolling at Georgia, played at Crowder (MO) College, where he received an associate degree in liberal arts.

Personal: He graduated from Rolla (MO) High School and was the captain of his baseball and football teams and also played basketball.

51^s Coaching Staff: Chad Mottola completed his second season as the Blue Jays' Triple-A hitting instructor...in 2011, the 51^s offense led the PCL with a franchise record .307 batting average and tied the team record with 352 doubles...in 2010, the 51^s offense established franchise records in total bases (2,414), doubles (352), extra-base hits (557) and most consecutive games with a home run (15)...in 2009, he served as the Roving Minor League Hitting Coach for the Blue Jays...served two seasons (2007-08) as the hitting coach for the Gulf Coast League Blue Jays...in 2007, he joined the ranks of coaching assisting with the Blue Jays Extended Spring Training program...played 16 seasons in professional baseball from 1992-2007...made his Major League debut with Cincinnati against New York on April 23, 1996. **Tom Signore** completed his first season as the pitching coach on the Triple-A level...he has spent a total of seven seasons in the Blue Jays organization (2005-11)...served the previous two seasons as pitching coach at Double-A New Hampshire (2009-10)...drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers and spent one season (1985) with the club's Pioneer League affiliate.
